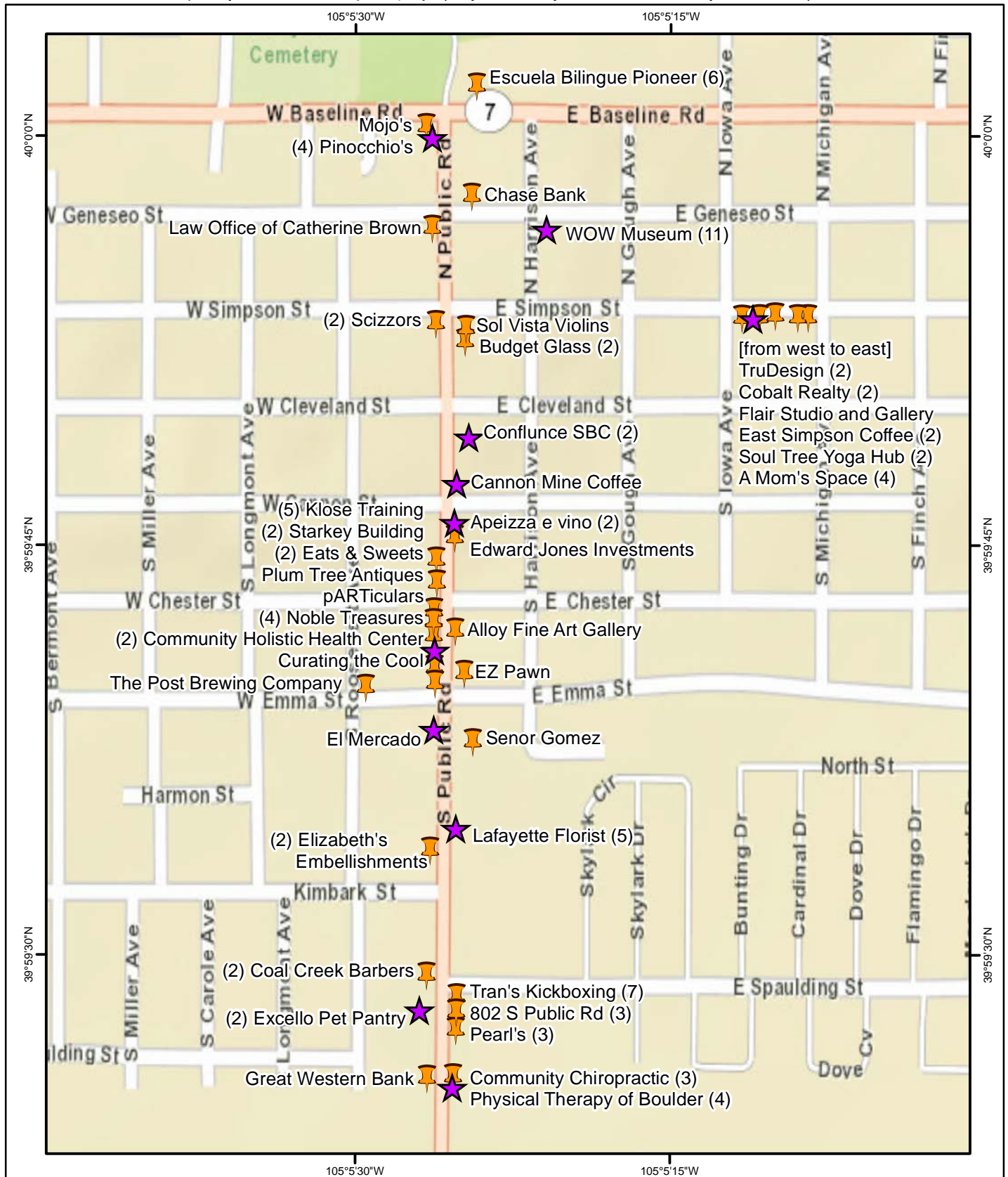


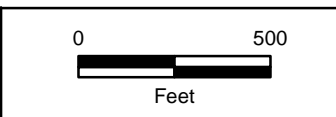
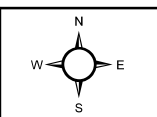

Grades K-2

1st place – Rowen Deane, Cobalt Realty #51.2

Wonderful variation in color, pattern, and proportion. With so many characters packed into the composition, this piece conveys that sense of community Halloween night provides. What a fun and scary group of friends!

2nd place – Arlo Gale, WOW Museum #7.11

This symmetrical composition is striking in its bold use of color, contrast, and playful dual view of the vampire's face, frontal and from the side. However it is serious in gaze and intent. Scary!

3rd place – Sophie Sims, Excello Pet Pantry #43.2

Organized use of color and contrast, with a wide variation in brush strokes. This work conveys a traditional autumnal scene of a pumpkin farm. All is well, until we see those ominous clouds above reminding us of the magical and often scary transformation Halloween season provides.

Grades 3-4

1st place – Miles Bell, Pinocchio's #4.4

Very nice picture of a fox in the fall. The colors used are fantastic, with good choices for the fox, tree, leaves, sky, and grass. Not only is the picture easily relatable, but it is fun and whimsical.

2nd place – Maia Esquibel, El Mercado #33

This is a great, fun picture reminiscent of Halloween. The picture of the bat is adorable and the colors of the sky, moon, houses, and land are distinct. Even the houses have a spooky, eerie quality. Nice, clear art with a sense of fun appropriate for the season.

3rd place – Anais Castro, Cannon Mine Coffee #19

This is a cute picture that speaks to the location where it was painted. The image of a ghou/ghost coming out of a mug evokes a playfulness that is noteworthy and appropriate for the season.

Grades 5-6

1st place – Elijah Spradling, Confluence SBC #16.1

Great details in the skull, especially with the teeth and the coloring. An exquisite tribute to Día de los Muertos that captures poignant facial features and incorporates piercing candle eyes that bring life to the skull.

2nd place – CJ Giseburt, Physical Therapy of Boulder #42.2

Extremely well executed, iconic Headless Horseman image. Excellent use of design, color, and many small details.

3rd place – Jessica Wilcox, Apeizza e vino #20.2

Great work with adding perspective to the center aisle. The joyous union of the dead shows there is hope for love ... even in the afterlife.

Grades 7-10

1st place – Roxy Poppick, Noble Treasures #28.2

Good use of color, good composition, great Halloween theme and style and very well rendered. Very skilled with shades and shadows, the moon's coloring is extremely impressive.

2nd place – Dannica Sims, Excello Pet Pantry #43.1

This image draws you in and makes you wonder what spooky vista is just around the bend and down the sidewalk. Great use of color, form, shapes, and perspective to build suspense and curiosity.

3rd place – Heather Peake, Lafayette Florist, #35.6

Come on in and find out your future. This psychic's window display and sign have great details and is extremely well rendered. Do you dare to find out your future?
